





Coptic Lesson 1

**Coptic Letters that look
like English letters and
are pronounced similarly**

<i>Letter</i>	<i>Shape</i>	<i>Pronun- ciation</i>	<i>How to write it</i>
<i>Alpha</i>	Α α	A (as in <u>ART</u>)	

<i>Letter</i>	<i>Shape</i>	<i>Pronunciation</i>	<i>How to write it</i>
<i>Vita</i>	B <i>B</i>	<i>V</i> (as in <u>VALVE</u> when followed by a vowel) <i>B</i> (as in <u>BELL</u>)

<i>Eyy</i>	€ €	<i>E</i> <i>(as in</i> <i><u>P</u><u>E</u><u>N</u>)</i>

<i>ZETA</i>	Ζ ζ	Z (as in <u>Z</u> OO)

ΑΒΒα	<i>Avva</i>	<i>Ava, father (bishop)</i>

ζαζ	<i>zaz</i>	Asphodel (a plant)
