

The Epistle of St Jude

DANGER! FALSE TEACHERS!

INTRODUCTION

The Epistle of Jude **polemicizes** against false teachers who have **penetrated** the church.

Jude is a frightening Book about the recurrent danger of error, rebellion, and judgment. Sound the trumpet!

Instruction and **consolation** are not the only duties of the pulpit.

There is still such a province in religious discourse, as the province of warning and rebuke.

They were not beyond the reach of that sinful infection.

He who perseveres to the end is not the man who imagines he is secure of never falling away.

The relationship between Jude and II Peter is uncertain as to:

The second chapter of the Second Epistle of Peter constitutes a remarkable peculiarity in that Epistle. The close resemblance between this chapter and the Epistle of Jude

- 1. which one was written first
- 2. why they are so similar yet different
- **3.** how one describes a coming heresy and the other a present heresy

Of the twenty-five verses in Jude, sixteen (vv. 3-18) have some association with II Pet. 2:1-18.

It is **generally accepted** that 2 Peter borrowed from Jude.

There are several instances in Scripture where writers have copied from one another, or from a common source.

- The following passages are coincident in words: compare 2 Samuel 22 with Psalm 18;
- Psalm 14 with Psalm 53;
- Psalm 115:4-11 with Psalm 135:16-21;
- 2 Kings 18:13-19 with Isaiah 36-39;
- 2 Kings 25:23, 24 with Jeremiah 40:7-9;
- 2 Chronicles 36:22, 23 with Ezra 1:1-3;
- Ezra 2 with Nehemiah 7;
- Isaiah 2:2-4 with Micah 4:1-3, etc.

This Epistle illustrates the theological balance between

 The keeping power of God (vv. 1,24)
 المحقوظين ليسوع المسيح القادر ان يحفظكم غير عاثرين

2. Believers keeping themselves (v. 21) احفظوا انفسكم في محبة

He is able to preserve us in our daily walk and keep us from stumbling.

God is preserving the fallen angels and the apostates for judgment, but He is preserving His own children for glory.

"And the angels who did not keep their proper domain, but left their own abode, He has reserved in everlasting chains under darkness for the judgment of the great day." و الملائكة الذين لم يحفظوا رياستهم بل تركوا مسكنهم حفظهم الى دينونة اليوم العظيم بقيود ابدية تحت الظلام (Jude 6)

AUTHOR

- Jude (Hebrew, Judah, or Greek, Judas) means "praise,"
- he was the son of Alphaeus by a sister of the
- Virgin (the son of a Mary [not the Virgin] who stood by the Cross.)
- characterizes himself by two designations
- 1. "a bond-servant of Jesus Christ" This is not exactly the same as St Paul's usual designation, although they look the same in English.

St Paul always puts the noun "slave" first, followed by the GENITIVE descriptive phrase. This is also true of II Peter. However, the word order in Jude is the same as the word order in James (descriptive GENITIVE phrase first). 2. "a brother of James" - There are many persons in the NT named James (Jacob), but the name by itself,

without any description, reminds one of James 1:1. St James, the cousin of Jesus, was the **bishop of the Jerusalem** church during St Paul's missionary journeys (cf. Acts 15).


It has been speculated that both chose, out of humility, not to identify themselves as biologically related to our Lord Jesus. The Apostle Jude/Thaddaeus/ Lebbaeus (Matt. 10:3; Mark 3:18; Lk 6:16; Acts 1:13).

Orthodox Study Bible: He is not Jude who was one of the Twelve.

and may be **identified with Thaddeus** in Matthew and Mark (BEDE).

St HILARY OF ARLES: He is distinguished from Iscariot

- The author was a Hebrew Christian and cousin of our Lord Jesus (cf. Matt. 13:55; Mark 6:3) rests on several assumptions 1. a family relationship to James (cf. James 1:1)
- 2. the extensive use of the OT
- **3. the characteristic Hebrew literary use of threes**

The Style

The Greek style and form of Jude is wellwritten Koine Greek. St Jude must have had a cosmopolitan exposure (cf. I Cor. 9:5). العلنا ليس لنا سلطان ان نجول باخت زوجة كباقي الرسل و اخوة الرب و صفا

As far as personality, he is much like St James; he uses a no-nonsense, straightforward approach to the mandate for godly living in this world of sin and rebellion.

DATE

- Let us list some of the parameters:
- 1. during Jude's lifetime as he was the younger brother of James and cousin of our Lord Jesus
- 2. the Epistle of Jude's literary relationship to II Peter. Of the twenty-five verses in Jude, sixteen (vv. 3-18) have some association with II Pet. 2:1-18.
- It is generally accepted that 2 Peter borrowed from Jude.

The contents of the book imply a mid-first century date. Enough time had elapsed for heresy to develop. The physical presence of the Apostles had just passed (vv. 18-19). However, a uniform doctrine had not developed. St Jude mentions the moral problems of the false teachers, but does **not** discuss the doctrinal errors. He uses OT examples.

In Historical Ecclesiasticus III:19:1-20:6, Eusebius mentions a tradition (1) that **Jude's grandsons** were taken to **Rome to face Domitian on charges of** treason; (2) that they were descendants of **Jewish** royalty; and (3) that they were **relatives of Jesus** of Nazareth. **Domitian reigned from A.D. 81-96.**

The Recipients

- The believers (whether a local church or geographical area is uncertain) were **facing massive invasion of error** through **speculative theology/philosophy.**
- What is known of the heresy:
- the heretics were part of the church meetings ("love feasts" cf. v. 12)

2. the heretics were immoral, manipulative teachers who were causing divisions among God's people (cf. v. 19)

"knowledge" (gnosis)

Many of the NT Books (Eph. - Col, the Pastorals, II Peter, I, II John) were written to combat a similar type of false teaching/teachers.

"Standardizing"

PURPOSE

St. Jude's purposes are: **1.To rouse the Church to declare war** on heterodoxy (v. 3). "Beloved, while I was very diligent to write to you concerning our common salvation, I found it necessary to write to you exhorting you to contend earnestly for the faith which was once for all delivered to the saints." ايها الاحباء اذ كنت اصنع كل الجهد لأكتب اليكم عن الخلاص المشترك اضطررت ان اكتب اليكم وأعظا آن تجتهدوا لأجل الايمان المسلم مرة للقديسين

2. To exhort the Church to orthodox faith and practice (vv. 20, 21). "But you, beloved, building yourselves up on your most holy faith, praying in the Holy Spirit, 21 keep yourselves in the love of God, looking for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ unto eternal life."

where possible (vv. 22, 23)

4. To instill confidence that God is indeed the Lord of all (vv. 1, 24, 25).
"and preserved in Jesus Christ"
"Now to Him who is able to keep you] from stumbling, And to present you faultless **Before the presence of His glory with** exceeding joy, **25 To God our Savior**, Who alone is wise, **Be glory and majesty, Dominion and power, Both now and forever.** Amen."

و القادر ان يحفظكم غير عاثرين و يوقفكم امام مجده بلا عيب في الابتهاج 25 الاله الحكيم الوحيد مخلصنا له المجد و العظمة و القدرة و السلطان الان و الى كل الدهور امين The very silence about heretics is itself typical of anti-heretical literature, where the author avoids giving more free publicity to the errors under attack by not mentioning them further.

St Jude **pleads** with the church to **remain faithful** to her tradition.

CANONIZATION

This book was initially accepted (cf. quote by Clement of Rome about A.D. 94), then later disputed and finally fully accepted (Council of Nicea, A.D. 325 and Carthage, A.D. 397).



The Epistle is quoted as an inspired and canonical work in some of the early fathers. Some words in it seem to be cited in a fragment of Irenaeus, "the most holy faith delivered unto us." Tertullian quotes it by name in his tract on "Female Dress," chap. 3: **"To these considerations is added the** fact that Enoch possesses a testimony in the Apostle Jude," etc. **St Clement of Alexandria also quotes it** by name ("Miscellanies," b. 3., chap. 2.):

"Concerning these and the like heresies, I think that Jude has spoken prophetically in his Epistle, 'Likewise those dreamers," etc. Also in Misc., 6:8: "And some pluck from the fire," etc.

Also in the "Paedagogus," 3:8: "'For I would have you know,' says Jude, 'that God, having once saved," etc. The Muratorian fragment also includes it in the Canon. 3. listed in the canonical lists of: a. Muratorian fragment (A.D. 200) b. Barococcio (A.D. 206) c. Athanasius (A.D. 36) 4. affirmed by Councils: a. Nicea (A.D. 325) **b. Hippo (A.D. 393)** c. Carthage (A.D. 397 and 419) 5. present in the translations of: a. Old Latin (A.D. 150-170) **b.** Syriac Revision, the Peshitta (5th **Century A.D.**)

Introduction: Greeting

THE APOSTOLIC BENEDICTION.

"Grace to you and peace be multiplied." (1 Pet. 1:2).

Mercy, peace, and love be multiplied to you. (Jude 2).

"Grace and peace be multiplied to you in the knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord." (2 Pet. 1:2).

Like the Apostle Peter, St Jude wanted these special blessings to be *multiplied* in their lives.

The Characteristics of the believers.

The call to service Consecration Guardianship (preserved)

"The faith which was once for all **delivered to the saints ("set-apart** ones.")." (John 10:27-29). The Apostolic tradition **Once for all delivered to the saints.** It cannot be changed.


Who they are? (1-4)

"But there were also false prophets among the people, even as there will be false teachers among you, who will secretly bring in destructive heresies, even denying the Lord who bought them, and bring on themselves swift destruction." (2 Pet. 2:1).

"For certain men have crept in unnoticed, who long ago were marked out for this condemnation, ungodly men, who turn the grace of our God into lewdness and deny the only Lord God and our Lord Jesus Christ." (Jude 4)

Who they are? The danger of departing from truth

Delivered & Destroyed: "But I want to remind you, though you once knew this, that the Lord, having saved the people out of the land of Egypt, afterward destroyed those who did not believe." فأريد ان اذكركم و لو علمتم هذا مرة ان الرب بعدما خلص الشعب من ارض مصر اهلك ايضا الذين لم يو منو ا (v. 5)

I will delight myself in Your statutes;" I will not forget Your word." بفرائضك اتلذذ لا انسى كلامك (Psalm 119:16) **St Clement of Alexandria, St Didymus** Those whom God delivered from Egypt he afterward **destroyed** if they did not believe.

Fallen angels

For if God did not spare the angels who sinned, but cast them down to hell and delivered them into chains of darkness, to be reserved for *judgment* (2 Pet. 2:4).

And the angels who did not keep their proper domain, but left their own abode, He has reserved in everlasting chains under darkness for the *judgment* of the great day (Jude 6)

The fallen angels are evil **not in their origin** but in their **failure to hold** to their origin (PSEUDO-DIONYSIUS).

Privileges create a capacity for suffering. Angels yet in chains under darkness. **Irrecoverable From light to darkness** from heaven to hell from felicity to misery. from a golden chair to a cage of iron Nebuchadnezzar fell from a man to a beast The Lord Jesus notes this apostasy in them to show that their sin was not by creation but by willful corruption.

And this is the cause, said St Augustine, why God has redeemed men and not angels, for that they sinned **from within** and of themselves maliciously and rebelliously; man sinned **from without** and by provocation. Their fall was great, so was their punishment. The higher their state and condition the more grievous their fall.

If it was much for Cain to be a vagabond,

and Adam to be driven out of Paradise, and Ishmael out of his father Abraham's house,

how much more for the angels to be driven out of heaven and not to return, like Noah's dove, to the ark, but to live in darkness for ever?

Sodom and Gomorrah.

"And turning the cities of Sodom and **Gomorrah** into ashes, condemned them to destruction, making them an example to those who afterward would live ungodly." (2 Pet. 2:6).

"As Sodom and Gomorrah, and the cities around them in a similar manner to these, having given themselves over to sexual immorality and gone after strange flesh, are set forth as an example, suffering the vengeance of eternal fire." (Jude 7)

Sodom and Gomorrah.

Carnal men are usually moved by carnal arguments, and tremble more to hear of the loss of their estates than of their souls. The synagogue of Satan may be utterly destroyed, but not the city of God. The usual **connection** between **false teaching** and **immoral living** is brought out clearly throughout this section. Filthy dreamers and defilers of the flesh and evil speakers:

المحتلمون

"dreamers"

Fantasize

As if they were sleepwalkers.

For every one to keep their hearts with all diligence from those **impure thoughts** in the **day-time**,

which may otherwise make them filthy dreamers in the night. Vain, false, empty imaginations.

"and especially those who walk according to the flesh in the lust of uncleanness and despise authority. They are presumptuous, selfwilled. They are not afraid to speak evil of dignitaries. (2 Pet 2:10)

Likewise also these dreamers defile the flesh, reject authority, and speak evil of dignitaries. (Jude 8)

Authority = lordship = dominion **Dignitaries = glories refer to angels. "Far above all principality and power and** might and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this age but also in that which is to come." فوق كل رياسة و سلطان و قوة و سيادة و كل اسم يسمى ليس فى هذا الدهر فقط بل فى المستقبل ايضا (Eph. 1:21).

Michael and the Body of Moses

Yet Michael the archangel, in contending with the devil, when he disputed about the body of Moses, dared not bring against him a reviling accusation, but said, "The Lord rebuke you!" و اما ميخائيل رئيس الملائكة فلما خاصم ابليس محاجا عن جسد موسى لم يجسر ان يورد حكم افتراء بل قال لينتهرك الرب

ST CLEMENT OF ALEXANDRIA: This proves that Moses was taken up into heaven. The one who fought with the devil as our guardian angel is here called Michael. **Origen mentions an apocryphal book called 'Ανάληψις or 'Ανάβασις Μωυσέως** in Greek, which was extant in his time. The apocryphal book: *The Assumption of Moses*

God only has the power of final decision. Omniscience, impartiality, and power belong to Him. God is the Judge "unto whom vengeance belongeth"

"So Moses the servant of the Lord died there in the land of Moab, according to the word of the Lord. 6 And He buried him in a valley in the land of Moab, opposite Beth Peor; but no one knows his grave to this day." فمات هناك موسى عبد الرب في ارض موآب حسب قول الرب 6 و دفنه في الجواء في ارض موآب مقابل بيت فغور و لم يعرف انسان قبره الى هذا اليوم (Deut. 34:5-6).

"Then he showed me Joshua the high priest standing before the Angel of the Lord,

and Satan standing at his right hand to oppose him. 2 And the Lord said to Satan, "The Lord rebuke you, Satan! The Lord who has chosen Jerusalem rebuke you! Is this not a brand plucked from the fire?" و ارانى يهوشع الكاهن العظيم قائما قدام ملاك الرب و الشيطان قائم عن يمينه ليقاومه 2 فقال الرب للشيطان لينتهرك الرب يا شيطان لينتهرك الرب الذي اختار اورشليم افليس هذا شعلة منتشلة من النار (Zec 3:1-2).

The angels defend the people of God. This is a warning concerning vehement accusations against God's enemies. Let God judge.

Ignorant speech

"But these speak evil of whatever they do not know; and whatever they know naturally, like brute beasts, in these things they corrupt themselves." و لكن هؤلاء يفترون على ما لا يعلمون و اما ما يفهمونه بالطبيعة كالحيوانات غير الناطقة ففى ذلك يفسدون (Jude 10). Searching for Jude's Sources.

BEDE: It is **not easy** to see **what part of Scripture** Jude got this tale from.

If the archangel Michael refrained from **cursing** the devil and dealt gently with him, how much more should we mere mortals avoid blaspheming, especially as we might offend the majesty of the Creator by an incautious word.

He is not content to compare them with Cain but adds Ba-laam and Korah as well.

"Woe to them! For they have gone in the way of Cain, have run greedily in the error of Balaam for profit, and perished in the rebellion of Korah." ويل لهم لانهم سلكوا طريق قايين و انصبوا الى ضلالة بلعام لأجل اجرة و هلكوا في مشاجرة قورح (v. 11)

Cain	Sinned by faithlessness and envy, especially over an honor given to his brother. It led him to murder.
Ba-laam	Sinned by greed, which led to lying.
Korah	Sinned by ambition, pride, and arrogance, grasping for leadership against God's will. It led him to blatant rebellion against God.

"These are spots in your love feasts, while they feast with you without fear, serving only themselves. They are clouds without water, carried about by the winds; late autumn trees without fruit, twice dead, pulled up by the roots; ¹³ raging waves of the sea, foaming up their own shame; wandering stars for whom is reserved the blackness of darkness forever."

هؤلاء صخور في ولائمكم المحبية صانعين ولائم معابلا خوف راعين انفسهم $(\mathbf{Vv.}\ 12)$ **Spots:** should be rendered "hidden reefs," those razor-sharp underwater growths that can damage and sink great ships. **<u>The love feast</u>**: Agape was a liturgical banquet tied to the Eucharist. A peaceful, joyful meal.

These are wells without water, clouds carried by a tempest, for whom is reserved the blackness of darkness forever. (2 Pet. 2:17).

They are clouds without water, carried about by the winds; late autumn trees without fruit, twice dead, pulled up by the roots; 13 raging waves of the sea, foaming up their own shame; wandering stars for whom is reserved the blackness of darkness forever. (**Jude 12-13**)



It is the duty of Christians to endeavor after spiritual fruitfulness (Matthew 3:8; Luke 3:8; 2 Corinthians 9:10; Philippians 1:11; James 3:17; John 15:2, 5,16; Colossians 1:10).

Twice dead dead to appearance, and dead in reality. Rotten fruit

Raging waves of the sea **Restless**, dark, bitter, destructive, and persistent. They crash and perish.

Enoch's Prophecy

TERTULLIAN: Since Enoch in the same book tells us of our Lord, we must not reject anything at all which genuinely pertains to us.

Do we not read that every word of Scripture useful for edification is divinely inspired 2 Tim 3:16.?

As you very well know, **Enoch was later** rejected by the Jews for the same reason that prompted them to reject almost everything which prophesied about Christ.

It is not at all surprising that they rejected certain Scriptures which spoke of him, considering that they were destined not to receive him when he spoke to them himself. Jn 1:11. But we have a witness to Enoch in the epistle of Jude the apostle.

I Enoch

Just a word about I Enoch. It was originally written in Hebrew (but is now lost except for fragments in Aramaic among the Dead Sea Scrolls), translated into Greek (only fragments survive) and by A.D. 600 copied into **Ethiopian** (one copy survives). The book was written in the inter**biblical period**, but was edited many times, as the Ethiopian copy shows.

An Ethiopic version was at length discovered in Ethiopia, and brought to England by the well-known traveler, Bruce.

But the likelihood is that the Book of Enoch was written after the Epistle of St. Jude, so that Jude could not have drawn the prophecy from the book; but, rather, the writer of the book inserted in it the prophecy that he might give to his forgery the appearance of truth.

It was very influential in the early church; Tertullian quotes it as Scripture. It was cited in the Epistle of Barnabas (as Scripture) and by St Irenaeus and St **Clement of Alexandria.** It had lost favor in the early church by the fourth century.

We are expressly informed that Enoch walked with God after he begat Methuselah three hundred years.

Thus was **Enoch** to the antediluvian world what **Elijah** was to those who lived beneath the law.

Whether Enoch Is a Prophet.

ST AUGUSTINE:

- Does not the canonical epistle of Jude the apostle openly declare that Enoch spoke as a prophet?
- It is true that his alleged writings have never been accepted as authoritative, either by Jews or Christians, but that is because their extreme antiquity makes us afraid of handing out as authentic works those which may be forgeries.

Whether Enoch Is Apocryphal.

BEDE: The book of Enoch, from which this quotation is taken, belongs to the Apocrypha, not because the sayings of that prophet are of no value or because they are false but because the book which circulates under his name was not really written by him but was put out by someone else who used his name. For if it were genuine, it would not contain anything contrary to sound doctrine. But as a matter of fact it contains any number of incredible things about giants,

who had angels instead of men as fathers, and which are clearly lies. Indeed, it was precisely because Jude quotes him that for a long time his letter was rejected by many as being uncanonical. Nevertheless it deserves to be included in the canon because of its author, its antiquity and the way in which it has been used, and particularly because this passage which Jude takes from Enoch is not in itself apocryphal or dubious but is rather notable for the clarity with which it testifies to the true light.



 After Enoch and Elijah are raised, **God's coming for** judgment is announced and eternal happiness is verified (11:15-18).
